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COURSE DESCRIPTION

As wildfires, a global pandemic, rising sea levels, warming ocean waters and increasingly frequent and violent storms have recently shown, climate change is a topic of imminent urgency. It is a convergence of plural crises that in the coming decades will need all hands on deck: It will require the cooperation of myriad fields of expertise rather than thinking in traditional disciplinary silos.

This course establishes a post-disciplinary, integrative conversation linking the science of climate change, philosophy, anthropology, cultural studies, media studies, film studies, literary studies, French, Spanish, and English studies, pedagogy and teacher education, ecocriticism and eco-pedagogy.

With the goal of creating larger popular awareness of the questions discussed, Prof. Dr. Volkmann, together with guest speakers with expertise in eco-pedagogy, will in particular explore pedagogical strategies for teaching the topics and materials discussed. Students will work together on binational teams and projects.
