

University Exchange Partnerships

Georgia College offers semester and academic year study abroad programs in more than 50 countries and 100 locations around the world. Students should begin the application process at least six months before they plan to begin their exchange.

There are many benefits to participating in a long-term study abroad program. The semester experience allows ample time to be immersed in a new culture, learn a new language, and make lifelong connections.

Students participate in semester long experiences during their junior or senior year in order to take upper division courses in their major or minor. While there are courses taught in many foreign languages, there are courses taught in English as well.

Students going on semester or academic year programs should have a grade point average of 2.75 or above. Unless noted otherwise, the deadline for Fall Semester exchanges is Feb. 1 and for Spring Semester is Oct. 1.
